








TRANSMISSION OF EBOLA

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF EBOLA

How is Ebola spread?

Ebola is spread through direct contact with the following:





<p>Soiled clothing of an infected person</p> 	<p>Body fluids such as blood, saliva, faeces, vomit, urine and sweat of an infected person</p> <p>Saliva</p>  <p>Blood</p>  <p>Vomit</p>  <p>Faeces</p>  <p>Sweat</p>  <p>Urine</p> 
<p>Unsterilised equipment use by an infected person</p> 	
<p>Handling wildlife whether alive or dead</p> 	

Signs and symptoms of Ebola are as follows:

 <p>Sudden onset of Fever</p>	 <p>Severe Headache</p>	 <p>Rash</p>
 <p>Red Eyes</p>	 <p>Chest pain</p>	 <p>Vomiting</p>
 <p>Diarrhoea</p>	 <p>Unexplained Bleeding</p>	<p>Signs and symptoms can start from 2 to 21 days of contact with an infected person or body.</p>

PREVENTION OF EBOLA

Ebola is a severe and often deadly disease that can be prevented by doing the following:

<p>Avoid direct contact with body fluids from any person or animal suspected of being infected with Ebola or infected with Ebola</p> 	<p>If you must handle a patient suspected to be suffering from Ebola, wear protective materials e.g. gloves and mask</p> 	<p>Persons who are suspected to have died from Ebola must be buried immediately by a trained burial team to prevent the spread of Ebola</p> 	<p>In case you handle a person suspected to be infected with Ebola, wash your hands thoroughly with soap and clean water</p>
